



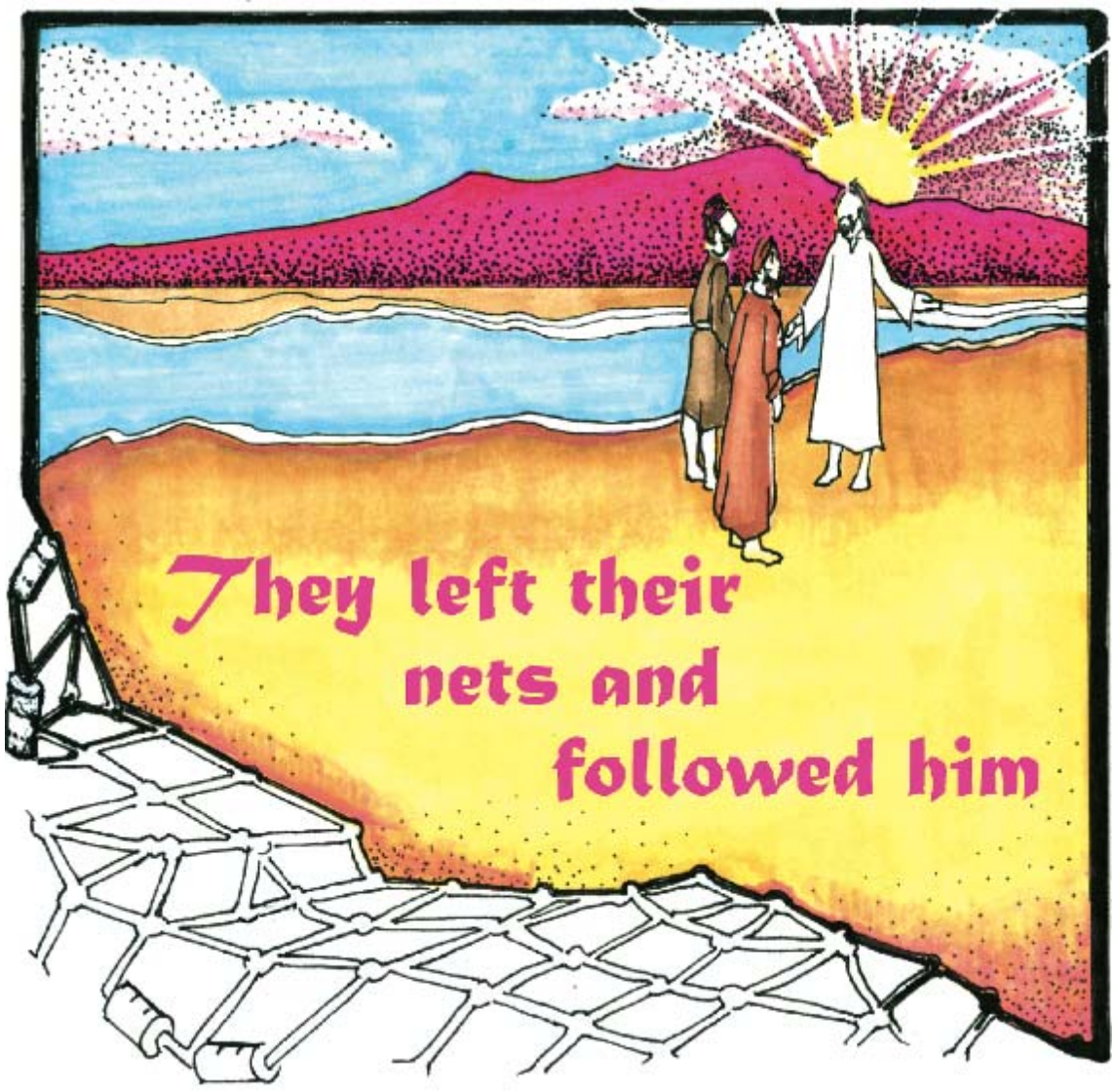

THE ELEVATOR PITCH

There's a new piece of jargon going around, mainly from the business community. It describes a quick, to the point, enthusiastic description of a business or project a person is presenting. The term is "the elevator pitch." Because people are so busy, the object is to make it fast --- fast enough that you could give it in the time of an elevator ride. That can be a challenge for something you feel passionate about!

On Tuesday, the Parish Council met and part of the discussion was about a meeting of potential pastors for those parishes who will have a change in leadership this summer. The setting is almost like a college fair. Parishes will have a table, on which they will have displays of the activities of the parish and people who can talk about what they love about their church. This is also known affectionately among priests as 'parish speed-dating' which will take place later in the month. Part of the responsibility of our representatives will be to give the parish 'elevator pitch.'

What are the good qualities of the parish? What are our strengths? How do we make a difference in the community? What are the opportunities for growth we'd like to see pursued in the next several years? How can we work together more efficiently and collaboratively with neighboring parishes?

One of the questions I will be asking of other parishes is, "I am interested in who you are, but I'm more interested in what you want to become. What are the hopes and dreams of your parish, and how do you see them becoming a reality?"

Saint Pascal is a vibrant and caring community. We preach the Word, we celebrate the sacraments, we support the religious education of our young people and families. In addition, we also do the work of faith. Standing strong in our desire to protect all human life is good to talk about, but it is better to actually assist single mothers who have the courage to bring their baby into the world. Our cooperative efforts with Monica's House and Aid for Women do this. Our solidarity with the poor is made real through our Saint Vincent de Paul Society which does so much important work right here in our own community. Our Domestic Violence Awareness group and Peace and Justice group keep us mindful

of our responsibilities that go beyond the walls of our parish and the call to change the world to build up the Kingdom of God. Our Watch the Love Grow benefit each Advent reminds us that just as we welcome the Christ-child at Christmas, so we must be aware of those who are hurting, and do something about it!

Occasionally I ask myself, "If Saint Pascal was to evaporate, would the wider community notice?" I think as long as we can continue to answer, "Yes!" and have our elevator pitch always in mind, we will remain relevant. It is about having a purpose and knowing it. And every person in the parish is responsible to make sure that purpose is fulfilled.

PRAYING FOR LIFE

As I just mentioned above, one of the key works of the Church is the defense of all human life. This takes on many different forms: care of the poor, defending the immigrant and refugee, working for just wages, standing against war and nuclear proliferation, proper health care for all, advocating for the sick, elderly and mentally challenged. This week in particular, we mourn the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion in America. This horrific act, given legal sanction under the rubric of privacy, is a perversion of our Constitution. And while we would like to change the laws, more importantly, we need to work on a change of heart. It seems to me that much of the violence we see in the world and in our streets, may have its roots in abortion. If we can kill an unborn child, why can't we kill people who bother us, offend us or are just in the way?

I know many women are caught in seemingly impossible positions and such decisions are a source of tremendous pain, before and after an abortion. If you have experienced or been involved in an abortion, there is a way to find forgiveness and comfort through the Project Rachel program of the Archdiocese. This can be a very healing process. No one is shunned or left in the cold in the Catholic Church or Saint Pascal and we want to help. Let's pray for all life and particularly for women struggling with heart-wrenching decisions.

Dear Parishioners,

Your Pastor, Fr. Paul Seaman, is now participating in the Catholic Leadership 360 Review process. This review process is part of the ordinary structure required by Archdiocesan Policy of every diocesan priest approximately every five years. It is an opportunity for Fr. Seaman to recognize his talents and to grow to become a better priest and pastoral minister. Your Dean, selected members of the parish staff and parish leadership and I will be asked to be reviewers using this instrument.

Further, diocesan policies also state that parish Lay leadership and ordinary parishioners be given the opportunity to recognize his gifts and to share their sentiments about his ministry. So, an Additional Parish-wide Survey is also part of his review process. The survey can be easily accessed by going to the Archdiocese's web page (Archchicago.org) and clicking on "Departments" on the upper left of the page, then scrolling to "Ministerial Evaluation" to access our web page. There, in the middle of the page, find "360 Catholic Leadership review for priests" and click on your appropriate language. Please note that the survey is available in English, Spanish, and in Polish.

The data obtained from the Parish-wide Survey will be shared with Fr. Seaman and your participation will remain anonymous. The Priests' Placement Board and I will also receive this data. If you have any concerns or comments pertaining to Fr. Seaman's review, feel free to contact me directly. If you have any further questions or suggestions about the review process you may contact Fr. Bob Heidenreich (rheidenreich@archchicago.org), Coordinator of Ministerial Review and Priests Programs, Priests Placement Office (312-534-5237).

When the Catholic Leadership 360 Review process has been completed Fr. Seaman will be asked to share the insights he has received and his further developmental plans with you in the parish bulletin and on the parish web site.

Thank you in advance for your willingness to participate and provide constructive information.

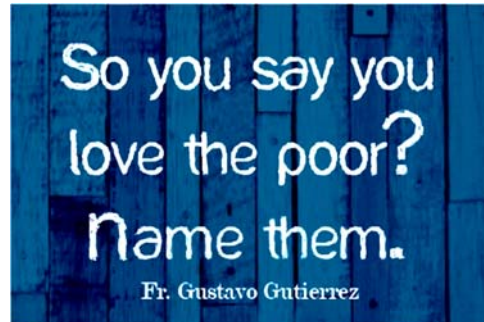
SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL SURVIVAL PACKS

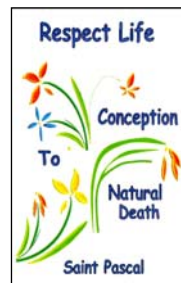

SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS

We believe that the celebration of the sacraments ranks among the most important gifts that we have. We look forward to sharing these celebrations with men and women who, in some way, are part of our community. Therefore, please note the following:

INFANT BAPTISMS: Registration in the parish is a prerequisite. Parents are required to attend a Pre-Baptismal Preparation Session at least two months prior to the Baptism. Meetings are held on the first Monday evening of each month (except for holidays). Baptisms are generally held on the third Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM based on the liturgical calendar. (Baptisms do not take place during Lent.) Arrangements can be made at the Parish Office.

RECONCILIATION: Every Saturday at 9:00 AM

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Saint Pascal requires either the bride, the groom, or the parent of either be registered and active as a parishioner for at least 6 months before contacting us to make any arrangements. Allow at least 6 months to complete wedding arrangements. Attendance at a music-planning workshop for the wedding Mass/ceremony is required. These are scheduled twice a year.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Anytime a person is facing a serious illness, surgery or hospitalization, it is proper to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please contact a priest.

MINISTRY OF CARE - HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS: Please call the Parish Office to arrange for Communion visitation.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Our Family Centered Catechesis Program is for families with children in grades K-8. Sessions meet once a month from September to May on either Monday evenings or Saturday mornings. In order for a child to receive the Sacraments, she/he must be enrolled in the program one year prior to the sacramental “prep” year.
